Pedagogical Intent

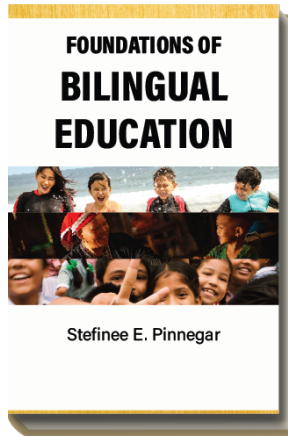
Teachers apply their knowledge of assumptions and stereotypes to their practice and instruction as they teach ELs in their classrooms.
