

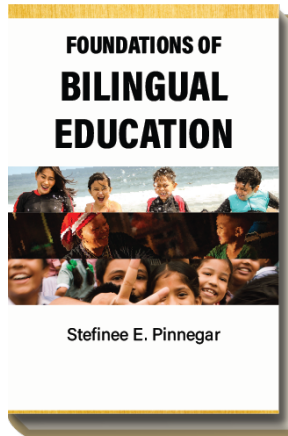
LA 4.2 : Discussion on Demographics
