Pedagogical Intent

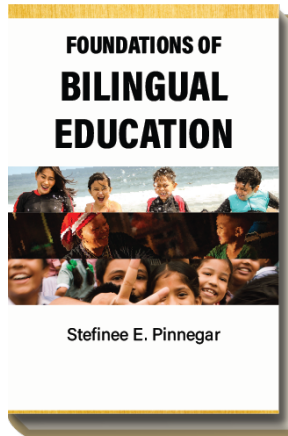
Prepare to read about case law and apply it to English learners in schools by developing understandings about the judicial branch.
