

VI. Preparing for an LIDT Career

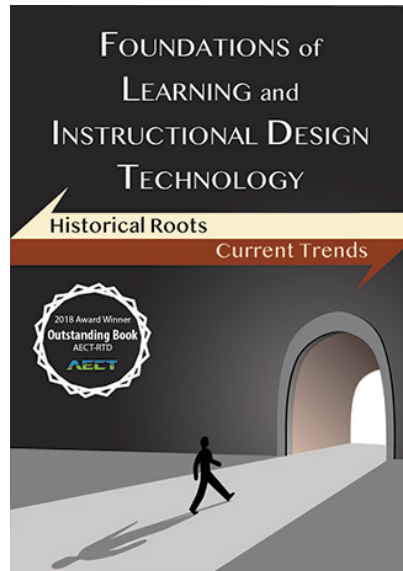
